We are placing a bid to host the 2004 USAB Midwest Badminton Classic for next January. We always host this tourney the weekend before Martin Luther King Day.

We worried that the cold temps would either keep the players away or give them a good reason to complain, but everyone found their own unique way of layering- a very popular fashion necessity in the Midwest this time of year. Luckily we had snow with no ice. If it is icy we might need to provide a shuttle service from the parking lot. It was fun to watch Kevin and Ben Hussey in the new "Father and Son Line-calling" event. Kevin and Bruce Pontow had to pull out of the men's doubles draw due to an injury Kevin got earlier that week, but Quin Hussey competed in his first tournament and kept 2 Husseys in the draw. I wish I had a camera to catch the reaction of another "drafted" volunteer lineswoman. This young lady was signaling and calling "out" as she watched the shuttle fly by the baseline at her end of the court. At the same time Beth Sopka was signaling "in" for the

sideline next to both of them. You would have thought that Beth, a USAB official must be blind as a bat from the facial expression of this young lady. After someone from the crowd whispered in her ear she understood they both made the correct call and continued to do a wonderful job! I think she had NO REGRETS. I really appreciate all the volunteers that assisted with calling lines!

A special "Thank-you" goes to all the OCBC group and others that traveled from near and far to play hard and provide the Midwest the opportunity to be entertained and mesmerized by the wonderful play. There were many video cameras moving around the courts trying to capture the action. It was very obvious that Kevin Han was the spectators favorite, because even when the officials tried to move his matches to other areas of the gym, strategically placing what they thought would be the most closely fought matches on the closest court, the crowd seemed to be drawn to him like a magnet. 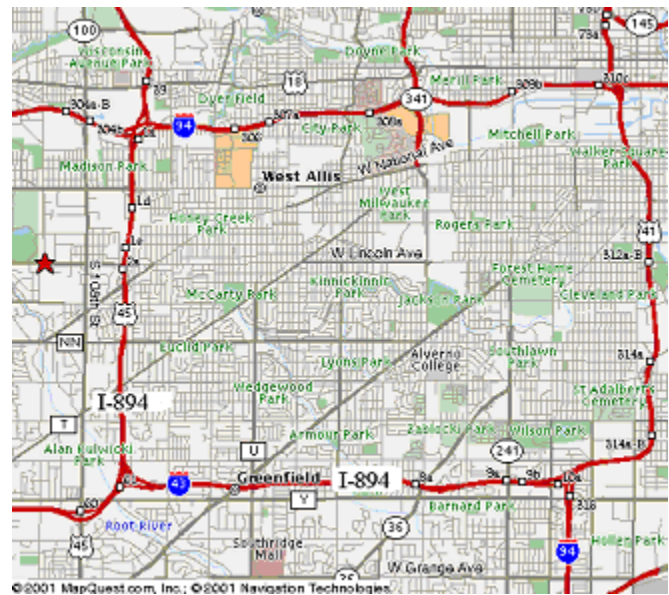

Howard Bach defeated Kevin Han to take the men's singles title. Then they played together to capture the men's doubles event. Kevin and Howard never seemed threatened during the tournament. While watching them play I became curious about what a few measurements might tell me concerning whether Howard or Kevin presents more of a visual block when they are in the up and back position. It might be that Howard Bach is "effectively" 8'6"! Howard is PEP-pure explosion and power! He is 23 years of age, actual height of 5'6", with his best vertical jump recorded at 35.5". Very impressive! Then there is Kevin Han who is 30 years young with his towering 6'2" frame. We don't see him jump as often, but his best recorded vertical jump is 30". Very impressive! Another factor that must be considered is arm length which I forgot to ask Kevin and Howard to give me. Obviously, Kevin has Howard beat here, so Kevin probably is a bit more of a visual block for Howard. It's just an interesting concept to contemplate. Regardless, they are a great team that is fun to watch. I know there were NO REGRETS for the spectators!

The men's doubles final with "Bouncing Bach" and "Hammering Han" against "Jumpin' Jimmy" (Jimmy Pohan) and "How To!" (Hao Tu) had a few exciting moments showing the great athleticism of all 4 players, but it didn't look like Bach and Han would really be challenged.

The mixed event was won by Bob Malaythong and Mesinee Mangkalakiri. Bob and Mesinee pretty much sailed through the matches in this tournament defeating Mike Chanswangpuvana and Eva Lee in the final. Maybe if I was playing against a blind 80 year old woman I could make a few of the deceptive moves like Bob Malaythong. What an incredibly gifted athlete with such great anticipation. He tracks the shuttle so well enabling his hands and feet to react very quickly. Mesinee Mangkalakiri played very well holding up her end of this mixed team.

The closest match of the "A" finals was the women's doubles. It was such a shame that these women were limited to the 11 point scoring format. This time it worked in favor of Jennifer Coleman and Eva Lee as they took the first game 11-7 with very solid play. Cindy Shi and Mesinee Mangkalakiri fought back from a 7-4 deficit to win the second game. The rallies were hard fought, but once the second game was set Jennifer and Eva seemed impatient and lost 3 quick points. The third and final game was very close when Jennifer and Eva changed ends serving at 6-4. The steady smart play of these 2 young women led them to victory.

There was a bit of Midwest prejudice for the team of Jennifer Coleman and Eva Lee since Jennifer has such strong Midwest connections. She played the best and most consistent that I have ever seen from her. Eva has quite a game of her own, especially for a 16 year old. I am sure Jennifer and Eva had NO REGRETS at the end of that match. Obviously, Fred Coleman was beaming with pride as he watched his daughter fulfilling one of her dreams right before his eyes.

It was a special treat to be able to look at the photo album of Kevin and Cindy's future badminton Olympian. What charming DNA he has! It won't be long before his grip is holding a baby badminton racket.

Cindy Shi won the women's singles event after pulling her game together in a semi-final 3 game match defeating Eva Lee 3-11, 11-0, 11-3, as well as a 3 game final defeating Budiyan Setiawan 2-11, 11-3, 11-3. It is amazing what Cindy has accomplished in her training just 4 ½ months after giving birth to her son. This was her first tournament to play in as a mother, as well as her first win as a mother. NO REGRETS!

I enjoyed getting to meet Ruth Menchaca and Michael Gamez from San Antonio. Ruth is moving very well after her ACL surgery and rehab. I enjoyed playing with her and look forward to seeing her game develop. It was a pleasure meeting several new players at this tournament.

There were many hard fought matches in the B,C,D,E draws where winners and runner-ups received money and t-shirts for awards. Since this facility has 15 courts the desk crew, players, officials and spectators were always busy. One thing that really helps keep everything on schedule is the campus food court just across the street. They provide a lot of variety for everyone.

I want to thank the USAB, MBA, Carlton, Louisville Badminton Supply, Indianapolis Badminton Club, and the Indiana State University staff for their assistance and sponsorships. What a great group of officials we had to help add more professionalism to the event.
